From the Stone Age to the Drone Age: Archaeologists gather to discuss the past at the 80th Annual Meeting of the Society for American Archaeology

San Francisco Venue for Society for American Archaeology Meeting

Washington, D.C. – Vikings, drones, anarchy, and prehistoric games are only some of the topics scheduled for the 80th Annual Meeting of the Society for American Archaeology, April 15-19, at the Hilton San Francisco Union Square, San Francisco.

“Orderly Anarchy in Prehistoric California,” the President's Forum, will open Wednesday evening. Sponsored by the Society for California Archaeology, the session will include scholars from inside and outside California discussing and evaluating Robert Bettinger’s case for socio-political evolution in indigenous California.

Paper and poster sessions covering the full range of human endeavor, including material culture, rock art, nutritional archaeology, and household rituals will fill out the conference days and evenings. Papers will cover the world from North and South America to Asia, the Pacific Islands, Europe, and Africa.

Examples of sessions include “Nose to Tail: An Interdisciplinary Look at Dogs in the Past,” “Not Just Blogging Archaeology: Media and Social Media’s Influence on Archaeology” and “Spanish to the Silicon: The Diversity of San Francisco Historical Archaeology.” Other sessions will cover the discovery of Transbay Man, forensic archaeology, hunter gatherers, and queer archaeology, and will showcase the

use of geographic information systems, new excavation practices, and new data handling methods.

Over 100 booths will fill the sold out exhibit hall, making it the exceptional one-stop opportunity for attendees to find the latest publications, software, field equipment, technology, data and analytic services, and other archaeological necessities.
